4. **TOWN MEDAL AWARD**

The Town Medal for the year 2016/2017 was awarded to Mr Ian Forster and the Corporate Town Medal to the Leander Club both of which were presented by Mr John Howell MP.

Mr Hugh Richardson, Leander Club gave a thank you speech and updated the meeting on the clubs achievements over the past 200 years.

5. **MAYOR'S REPORT**

The Mayor, Councillor J Brookes informed the meeting that this has been a very busy and exciting year including such events / activities as: HM Queens 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebrations, Building of the Rugby Club, club house, Hero's Return, Regatta, Remembrance Service, Christmas – Living Advent, Festival, Christmas Tree / Lights, Townlands Hospital formally opened, Housing Communities Agency approved the YMCA as a provider of registered housing and the Park Run trials and dress rehearsal.

- Reema Shearman – River & Rowing Museum stated that the Museum is an educational charity that has been in Henley for 20 years. She gave thanks to Henley Town Council for their financial support and encouragement and to the Mayor and Councillor S Evans as trustees.

There were 100,000 visitors to the museum last year bringing £1.9m into Henley. Free admission was given to all local children because of the funding provided by the Town Council.

The museum is passionate about history and arts, and teaches about the river, rowing and the history of Henley on Thames.

19,000 children visited the museum through the educational services from 200 different schools and the museum supports university internships.

There is a new gallery dedicated to John Piper and in the year ahead there will be exhibits on the Big Friendly Giant and Peter Rabbit, there is a new community gallery and a new catering company who offer wood fired pizza and are open in the evenings and at weekends.
